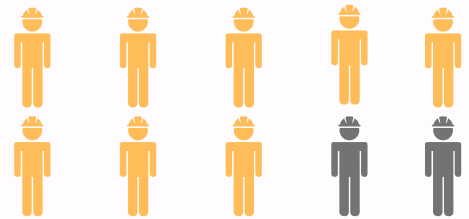
Ohio's gold-standard in job training & workforce development

Ohio's Affiliated Construction Trades are committed to providing equitable access to middle-class construction careers for all Ohioans. At 80 Building Trades JATC Apprenticeship Training Centers across the state, a diverse new generation of union construction apprentices are training for careers in a variety of skilled trades.

8 out of 10 construction apprentices in Ohio begin their careers in Building Trades Training Programs*



In Ohio, 86% of all apprentices who identify as people of color are in union Building Trades Programs*.



In Ohio, 91% of all female apprentices are in union Building Trades Programs*.



Increasing diversity in construction apprenticeships strengthens our industry and the communities we build. Ohio's Affiliated Construction Trades work to build inclusive pathways to middle-class construction careers for all Ohioans through tuition-free, earn-and-learn JATC trade apprenticeships.

Ohio Building Trades unions and contractors invest over \$50 MILLION ANNUALLY to train and certify construction industry professionals.

Meaningful Careers for Ohio's Veterans

Across Ohio, over 900 veterans a year pursue post-military careers as union Building Trades Apprentices*. ACT Ohio and its members connect veterans and Ohio National Guard members with middle-class construction careers through a variety of programs which allow the use of G.I. Bill benefits to cover expenses:

United Association Veterans in Piping (VIP)

The UA provides 18-week, on-base accelerated training for enlisted men and women. When they separate from service, veterans transition into careers as plumbers, pipefitters, welders, and service technicians. **UAVIP.org**
